

### **Humboldt University**

- Established in 1810
- The oldest of Berlin's three universities
- Considered the "mother of all modern universities"
- 28,000 students (excluding Charité)
- Undergraduate and graduate programs







Branch Library of Law

- Until 1831, library materials were supplied by the Royal Library
- The University Library was founded in 1831
- Today, the library is one of the central institutions of the University
- The Library is open to the public; library cards are free

Branch Library of Theology

- Currently 13 locations (incl. the Archives and the Art Collections of Humboldt University)
  - Central Library (Grimm Centre)
  - Natural Sciences
  - Law
  - Theology
  - ..
- Concentration process is in progress
- One track library system
  - Common acquisition budget
  - Central personnel administration
- Integrated Library System: Aleph 500 (Ex Libris)







Branch Library of Classical Archaeology

- The majority of the books and journals are sorted by the "Regensburger Verbundklassifikation"
- Some collections are (still) sorted by other classification systems that were historically used by some branch libraries
- Open access to the stacks
- Grimm-Centre: largest open access collection in Germany (about 2 million volumes)



### Jacob-und-Wilhelm-Grimm-Zentrum (I)

- Opened in October 2009
- Architect: Max Dudler (\*1946)
- Has won several architectural awards
- Arose from the merger of the central library and 12 branch libraries
- Collections comprise Arts and Humanities,
  Social Sciences and Economics

### Jacob-und-Wilhelm-Grimm-Zentrum (II)

- Reading terraces form the core of the Grimm Centre
- Nine terraces cover five floors
- The Grimm Centre is frequented by
  4,000 7,000 people daily
- The Grimm Centre is the second most visited library in Germany











### Jacob-und-Wilhelm-Grimm-Zentrum (III)

- The Grimm Centre provides more than 1,000 work stations
  - 450 Public computer work stations
  - 51 Study carrels
  - 8 Study rooms for groups
- Lounge areas with red armchairs offer opportunities to relax
- Separate room for users with children on the 7th floor
- "Homezone" for Humboldt students and staff

### **Erwin-Schrödinger-Zentrum: Branch Library of Natural Sciences**

- Campus Adlershof
- University Institutes of Sciences
- More than 400 technology-orientated companies
- The Branch Library of Natural Sciences houses the collections of Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics/Computer Science, Physics and Psychology
- Driverless transportation system


Building of the branch library Campus Nord; Former lecturehall at Campus Nord that is now used as a reading room

### **Branch Library Campus Nord**

- Opened in October 2009 in the former Central Library building
- Houses the collections of Agricultural Sciences,
  Economics and the Social Science of Agriculture
  and Forestry, Biology, English and American
  Studies as well as Sports Science
- Further collections will be integrated

- Private library of the Brothers Grimm (6,000 volumes)
- Libraries of several famous scholars from Berlin of the 19<sup>th</sup> century
- Collection of nearly 1,400 autographs
- Collection of documents
- Incunabula and manuscripts
- Biggest collection of doctoral and postdoctoral theses in Germany
- Special focus on Folklore, Ethnology and Higher Education
- Digitization via e-books on demand (eod)

## Campaign "My Grimm ... must be repaired"






Books of the Private Library of the Brothers Grimm Photo: Zappe

- The private Library of the Brothers Grimm is one of the most important private libraries of the 19<sup>th</sup> century
- Extensive renovation work is necessary to preserve the books
- Maintainance work is funded by the Campaign "Mein Grimm" ("My Grimm")







Check-out-machines in the Grimm Centre

- Since 2008 implementation of the RFID Technology
- Promoted by the European Union
- Implemented in the check-out and return machines (incl. fee payment)
- Two functions of the RFID-Tags: issuing and saving books and other resources




### **Primus – The new Search Portal**



- Primus (Primary University Search) is the new search portal of the University Library
- "One-stop shop"
- Searches the catalogue as well as many other databases
- Simultaneous search for books, journals, articles etc. in print as well as electronic resources
- Direct access to full text
